





What is the college of your major?








- Dr. Vaughan is a cool guy, and good professor. The work that is required for the 2-credit class he teaches is just too much. It's all fun stuff, for the most part, but the amount of work is not in line with the amount of credits granted for the course.
- Fun course but ridiculous amount of workload outsde of class. There should be a lab for the amount of projects in this class
- Great course. A lot of practical applications. Should be less work outside of class for a two hour course.
- Great instructor as far as teaching goes, but is a little condescending towards students and could use more patience/understanding when dealing with students. Course work is too much for a 2 credit hour, especially with the last project of the semester.
- I liked this course but the work load was extremely high for a 2 credit course. The robotics portion of this class was interesting but most ppl in this class did not actually have time to fully learn how to use it which negatively affected their grade because of how dependent the final project was on robotics. I hate to say it, but this isn't a robotics class. I understand that the robotics was used to help understand the mechanical design process but this particular class depended to heavily upon it. Most people in this class had never even been exposed to robotics before which made it difficult to succeed in this class.
  - The last issue is the grading. The students never new exactly what their grade was at any point during this semester. I also do not like the fact that for the final project, students are practically ranked against each other and based on their ranking determines their grade for the final project.
  - All in all though, I do believe this class could grow into a great introduction course for Mechanical design.
- The end of this class was a load of fun. Building the final project has been one of the most enjoyable parts of my semester. But the amount of work around the other projects is too much too close together. Presentations and reports are due the day after the project related build is due. this leaves very little time to get this done. Overall to improve this class i would say spread out the due dates and buy more readily available mouse traps for the final project.
- This class should be offered as at least 3 hrs with the amount of time it requires. Timeliness of returning grades was poor and the lack of using Moodle, at this point in the semester, I still don't know what my current grade in the class is.
- This really is a great course, but it takes up most of my time, even more than my 5 other 3-credit classes combined. Being that this is a 2-credit course, I think at least some disclaimer should be present (affected my performance in other important classes). Its a rigorous course which forces you to be resourceful and learn on your own where possible, and teaches you a lot. You gain a lot of experience other classes don't offer. Its just too much with more than 3-4 other classes (and I have 5 other classes...) It would make a great class during the summer as an isolated course/experience.
- Very interesting course and a lot was learned. However, this class demands an extreme amount of time (double that of any other class), it could recieve a 4 credit designation to allow more time to focus on this material.
